Mercury – In Pisces; Rises approximately 6:20 am Venus – In Taurus, sets approximately 11:50 pm Mars –In Capricornus; rises approximately 3:50 am Jupiter – In Sagittarius; rises approximately 3:00am Saturn – In Capricornus; rises approximately 3:15am Uranus – In Aries; sets approximately 8:50pm Neptune – In Aquarius; rises approximately 5:30am

The Lyrid meteor shower is from April 16-25 and peaks on April 23rd.
